General Competition Rules

1. **All Greek Week participants must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student of Cal Poly Pomona.** Only the students listed in current active chapter rosters as published quarterly by the Greek Affairs Office may be permitted to enter in any events. Any discrepancies will be handled by the Greek Week Chairs, Greek Council and the Greek Advisor.
2. Any National and Local Sorority and Fraternity that is recognized by the Office of Student Life is allowed to participate.
3. Intoxicated participants and spectators will **not** be tolerated. **Any intoxicated participant or any intoxicated active member spectator will be asked to leave the grounds and the members' fraternity or sorority will be disqualified from the day's events.** Any other intoxicated spectators will be removed from the grounds. A second violation of the intoxication policy, as stated in Cal Poly's University Guidelines, will result in further action to be taken by the Office of Student Life and Cultural Centers against your organization.
4. There will be two components that will affect the scoring process. One component is the overall competition points from the day's events. The second will be the organization's participation points.
5. All events must adhere to the day's rules and guidelines, as stated in the Greek Week Operating Rulebook, which is provided to the chapters prior to Greek Week.
6. Greek Week dues must be turned in by the first General Greek Council meeting of Spring Quarter, **April 3, 2009.**
7. Chapter rosters are due the first General Greek Council Meeting of Spring Quarter, **April 3, 2009.** However, new members may be added to the roster preceding Spring Quarter Rush. **No further additions may be made once the final roster is turned in.**
8. **Disruptive behavior, as determined by the Office of Student Life, is not permitted. Disruptive behavior can result in deduction of the overall points scored by chapters.**
9. All competition pairings, order of performance, and location of plots will be determined by a public drawing prior to each event. All chapters should refer to each day's rules and guidelines for arrival times. If no registration time is specifically noted, group representation should arrive 15-30 minutes early to all events.
10. All complaints and discrepancies for the day's events must be filed by the **team's Greek Week chapter representative** and must be filed a **maximum 2 hours** after the event has concluded.

11. Trophies will be awarded to the top Sorority and Fraternity TEAMS that have accumulated the most amounts of points throughout the week.

12. Each team is required to designate a Greek Week Representative, **1 per chapter**, who will serve as a liaison for their chapter. **Only this individual may approach the Greek Week Committee members concerning a ruling decision. Any other person approaching the Greek Week Committee will be considered as grounds for complete DQ from that event.**

13. The breakdown of money raised throughout the week is as follows: The Christina Burmeister Foundation, California State Polytechnic University's Dream Scholarship, and United Friends of the Children will each receive 30% of the money raised. The Greek Council will receive 10% of the money raised.

14. The team's Greek Week chairperson is **only allowed to miss 2 Greek Week meetings. The chapter president may be the chapter alternate** that is allowed to sit in for the chairperson during these absences. **If more than two meetings are missed, consequences may include and are not limited to deduction of points.**

15. Rules not specified in this Rulebook must still follow Cal Poly Pomona's University Guidelines. In the event of conflicting rules, Cal Poly Pomona's University Guidelines will always prevail.

ALL DECISIONS MADE BY THE GREEK WEEK CHAIRS, GREEK COUNCIL PRESIDENT, AND THE GREEK ADVISOR ARE FINAL!

Intoxication Understanding Statement

The Office of Student Life in conjunction with the Greek Week Committee defines intoxication as being under the influence of any drug (which includes, but is not limited to alcohol). An intoxicated person is considered any person who has the slightest amount of a drug (alcohol included) introduced into their body since they woke up that morning.

The Office of Student Life in conjunction with the Greek Week Committee defines a representative of your organization as one who is participating in a Greek Week Event, one who is competing in a Greek Week, or one who is attending a Greek Week event in any capacity (i.e. as a committee member, spectator, etc.).

My Organization understands why intoxicated members of the Cal Poly Pomona community can be harmful, embarrassing, and against the Mission Statement of the University. No one from my organization will show up to any event as a participant, competitor, and spectator or otherwise, while intoxicated as defined above.

My Organization also understands that it will be up to the Office of Student Life and the Greek Week Committee or one of its representatives, to determine the intoxication of an organization's representative. My organization understands the repercussions for violations of this policy are up to the discretion of the Office of Student Life and the Greek Week Committee, keeping in mind that disqualification from an event or from the Overall Competition is possible.

The Office of Student Life and Greek Week Committee out of concern for my organization, in the best interest of Cal Poly Pomona community's well-being, and in an effort to make the Greek Week competition enjoyable for all participants requires your compliance with this policy.

Sportsmanship Clause

Greek Council encourages all chapters to uphold the five facets of sportsmanship throughout Greek Week.

Five facets of sportsmanship have been identified as:

- Full commitment to participation
- Respect and concern for rules and officials
- Respect and concern for social conventions
- Respect and concern for the opponent
- Avoiding poor attitudes toward participation

Non-compliance of any of the above sportsmanship attitudes will result in loss of points and possible disqualification from Greek Week.

Responsibilities of Chapter Greek Week Chairs

- 1. The Greek Week Chairperson is responsible to attend all Greek Week meetings prior to and during Greek Week.** The Chair is responsible for communicating all information presented during meetings to their chapters and making them aware of all rules and any changes that may occur.
- 2. The Greek Week Chair is responsible for remaining after events to help with clean up. If the Chair is unavailable the Co-Chair or a suitable replacement must be present. We ask that three additional chapter members assist in clean-up.**
- 3. The Greek Week Chair is the ONLY spokesperson for their chapters in regards to rules, discussions with officials, and complaints.** Only one Chair per chapter and a total of two per team may act as the spokesperson for the entire week. If for any reason the Chair cannot be present at events, the Programming Chairs must be notified in written form by the end of the prior night's events. Any chapter that violates this policy will be subjected to penalties or disqualification from the day's events.
- 4. The team's Greek Week chairperson is only allowed to miss 2 Greek Week meetings. The chapter president may be the chapter alternate that is allowed to sit in for the chairperson during these absences. If more than two meetings are missed, consequences may include and are not limited to deduction of points.**

Wine Tasting and Auction

100 Points Possible (10%) – This event will be held at 7 AM., Sunday, May 3, 2009 in the Rose Garden.

I. Description

- a. Volunteering and helping those associated with the Wine Tasting and Auction Event

II. Time for Check In:

- a. Event starts at 12 noon. Must be 21 or older to work actual event (12:30-5)
- b. Shifts start at 7am and are in 2.5 hour intervals.
- c. Volunteer time: 7am-7:30pm

III. Rules and Guidelines

A: All teams must have 40% of all rostered members at the wine tasting and auction.

B: Volunteer forms are due April 15, 2009.

C: All Volunteers must wear khaki bottoms and come to shift dressed.

D: Volunteer forms will be available January 28, 2009

E: T- Shirts will be given out April 29, 2009 at Greek Council General Meeting.

F: Must Check IN and OUT to get participation credit!

G: **“While you are volunteering you are not allowed to bid on the auction items and are explicitly prohibited from tasting any alcoholic beverage. If a member of an organization is found in violation of these policies, they will automatically disqualify their organization from Greek Week and sent to the Office of Judicial Affairs.” Then there is no question whether or not you are 21, that as a representative of our Greek System you cannot partake in any tasting.**

Greek Quarterly

100 Points Possible (10%) – This event will be held at 5:30 P.M., Monday, May 4, 2009, in Ursa Major, Bronco Student Center.

I. Description

A. Gathering of all Sorority and Fraternity chapters for an informational meeting and program.

II. Time for Check-In and Start of Greek Quarterly/Spirit Day

A. Check in for Greek Quarterly begins at 5:00 p.m. and will end at 5:30 P.M. Individuals in line by 5:30 P.M. will still be allowed to check in.

B. The program will begin promptly at 5:30 P.M.

III. Rules and Guidelines

A. All teams must have 60% of all rostered members present at the Greek Quarterly/Spirit Day.

B. Chapter members are required to wear chapter paraphernalia.

C. Cal Poly Pomona ID's are required at the time of check- in.

D. Check in from 5:00PM until 5:30PM.

E. The above listed criteria are required in order to receive full points.

F. Past Greek Quarterly Events will be taken into account.

IV. Scoring

The following points will be awarded to the fraternity or sorority based on the percentage of chapter participation.

Can Structure Day

150 Points Possible (15%) – This event will be held at 8:00 AM., Tuesday, May 5, 2009 in the University Park (in front of the Bronco Student Center).

I. Description

- A. The individual chapters will build a can structure using **NO MORE** and **NO LESS** than **500** cans.
- B. The cans must be unaltered canned-food items. No other cans may count. Labels may not be removed marked or painted. All other cans must be removed from the area or a loss of points will be deducted from your total score.
- C. Each participating team **MUST** use a wooden platform in order to create a level area to place can structure on. This wooden platform may be painted, but **NOT** decorated with any other materials.
- D. The structure design is to the discretion of the chapters in keeping with the overall theme. Letters may be on the side of plot and may be decorated.
- E: See attached addendum for judges scoring sheet.

II. Plot Selection and Set-Up Time

- A. Plots will be chosen randomly from a raffle the morning of the competition in front of building 26, the old stables. All Chapter Greek Week Chairpersons must be here at 9:00a.m.
- B. Cans must be placed in rows of 50 for officials to count **NO LATER** than 10:00a.m.
- C. Participants may begin to build structures **NO EARLIER** than 10:00a.m. **ONLY IF ALL** cans have been counted by the officials.
- D. Platforms may not be placed inside the plot before than 10:00a.m.
- E. Structures must be finished by 11:30a.m. There will be **ABSOLUTELY NO** finishing touches or building of any kind after this time.
- F. Judging will begin promptly at 12:00 P.M.
- G. No people may be part of or in the plot in any way and may not be present on the platform or plot while it is being judged.

III. Rules and Guidelines:

- A. The dimensions of the plot will be 15 FT long by 8 FT deep.
- B. The dimensions of the structure cannot be larger than 10 FT high, 15 FT long by 8 FT deep. The measurement of height will be measured at the tallest point of the fence to the lowest part of the fence.
- C. Cans MAY NOT be decorated in any way. The label of the can MUST be clearly shown and undamaged as we will be donating these to a local shelter. Damaged cans will result in a loss of points from your total score.
- D. No items other than the canned food may be used to create the structure with the exceptions of tape, cardboard or similar items THAT ARE STRICTLY USED TO SUPPORT your structure may be used. This must be approved by the Greek Week Chairs ONLY and may not be painted, decorated, or change the natural aesthetics in any way.
- E. Each participating team MUST use a wooden platform in order to create a level area to place can structure on. This wooden platform may be painted, but NOT decorated with any other materials. Any standing platform cannot be higher than 5 inches in height.
- F. ABSOLUTELY NO other structures or additional items may be allowed in or be part of the plot or platform. **Failure to do so will result in a loss of 50 points.**
- G. No digging or sharp edges into the ground may be allowed.
- H. No live animals, open flame, fire, or hose connections will be allowed. Nothing other than your letters may be allowed to be placed behind your plot.
- I. All can structures must be broken down, boxed, and loaded onto the trucks designated by 4:00PM. **Failure to do so will result in a loss of 50 points.**
- J. Vehicles will not be allowed on the grass. Any damage caused by a sorority or fraternity vehicle will be held liable by that chapter. **Failure to do so will result in a loss of 50 points.**
- K. Failure to adhere to these rules and guidelines may result in a penalty of point loss from the day's events or a disqualification.

IV. Judging Criteria

- A. The following are worth a combined 100 points

Creativity: 25 Points

Presentation: 25 Points

Sturdiness: 25 Points

Spirit: 25 Points

B. Teams will be awarded a maximum of 25 points for each of the above listed criteria's. The total overall score from the 4 criteria's will be added together. The team with the most points will be awarded the following:

Quiz Bowl

150 Points Possible (10%) – This event will be held at 5:30 P.M., Wednesday, May 6, 2009 in Ursa Major, Bronco Student Center.

I. Description

A competition based on common everyday knowledge.

II. Check-In/Arrival Time

A. Chapters must have 60% of their members present in order to receive full participation points.

B. Check in will begin at 5:00 P.M. and end promptly at 5:30 P.M. Individuals in line by 5:30 P.M. will still be allowed to check in.

C. The competition will begin promptly at 5:30 P.M.

III. Rules and Guidelines

A. A team of (4) active roster members will represent each team.

B. (2) teams will compete at a time, in single elimination rounds.

C. All chapter Greek Week Chairpersons and teams should be present 30 minutes prior to the start time.

D. A public drawing will take place 15 minutes prior to the start of the competition. This will decide each chapter's competition schedule.

G. If you buzz in early, the question will cease to be read.

H. Incorrect answers will result in the loss of the points possible.

I. If you answer incorrectly, the opposing team will have the opportunity to answer the question which will be reread in full.

J. A MAXIMUM LIMIT OF 10 MINUTES will be allotted for each round. At the end of the round the questions will cease to be read and the scores finalized.

IV. Scoring

B. Participation points will be awarded based on the following percentages of chapter participation:

100%- 60% 40 Points

Food Fair Day

100 Points Possible (10%) – This event will be held at 11:30 AM., Thursday, May 7, 2009 in the University Park (in front of the Bronco Student Center).

I. Description

A. Each team will sell allotted food item that Greek Week Day Chairs have approved.

II. Set Up Time and Begin of Sales

A. ALL set up of the Food Fair cannot begin until 10:00 A.M. and completed by 11 A.M.

B. Sale of the Carnival Food will begin at 11:30 P.M. -1:00 P.M.

C. We will have a brief meeting near the fountain in the Stables at 1:10P.M. SHARP, where you will turn in all of your fundraised monetary donations to the Greek Week Chairs. Please turn it in to the respective chairs in a sealed envelope with your team's name on it.

III. Rules and Guidelines:

A. Plots will be chosen randomly from a raffle the morning of the event in front of building 26, the old stables. All Chapter Greek Week Chairpersons must be here at 9 a.m.

B. The food must be sold within the 15FT long by 10FT deep plot, staked out prior.

C. The carnival food must be approved by Environmental Health & Safety Services Department and 2 food handler's permits per team are required.

D. Each team must have a food handler's permit and the permit holder must be at the plot at all times while food is being sold. A loss of 50 points will be deducted from your total score.

E. All teams must have proper food handling utensils, gloves, and supplies.

F. Vehicles will not be allowed on the grass. Any damage caused by a sorority or fraternity vehicle will be held liable by that chapter. This includes, but is not limited to, fines and disqualifications for that event.

H. No live animals, digging, or sharp edges into the ground are allowed.

G. Failure to adhere to these rules and guidelines may result in a penalty of point from the day's events and/or a disqualification.

IV. Judging Criteria

There will be no scoring for this day, as long as the \$250 cap of raised money has been met. Each chapter that contributes a \$250 donation to the Greek Council from their Food Fair earnings will be allotted the full 100 points. Chapters that turn in less than \$250, will receive no points for the day. An individual award will be given to the chapter who raises the most money. It is **STRONGLY** encouraged for chapters to raise the most money that they can.

Greek Olympics

150 Points Possible (15%) - This event will take place on Thursday, May 7, 2009 at 6:00 P.M. at TBD

I. Description

A competition between Fraternities and Sororities in a series of athletic events.

II. Location and Time

All members participating in events will arrive at 5 p.m. for check in. Events will begin at 6 p.m.

III. Events

Obstacle Relay Race
Human Wheelbarrow Race
Surprise Event
Tug of War

Women's

Obstacle Relay Race

IV. Rules and Guidelines:

A. Obstacle Relay will consist of a ½ lap sprint, ¼ lap three-legged race, dizzy bat, tire run, and potato sack race.

B. The Human Wheelbarrow Race will consist of four members, two teams of two. The teams will consist of a "wheel barrower," who has their hands on the ground, and the "runner," who holds the legs of the "wheel barrower". The two will proceed down the stated course; once they reach the halfway mark of the course, they will switch positions in the designated area so the "wheelbarrow" is now the runner and vice versa. Once the first group has reached the end of the course the second group will proceed back to the direction of the starting line. Duplicating the first groups course. Time will not stop until all body parts are past the finish line. This event will be timed and compared to all teams when completed to establish a winner.

C. Pyramid Race will consist of 10 sorority members going from a standing position into a full pyramid of 4, 3, 2, 1.

D. Time begins when the first knee hits the ground.

E. Time will not stop until a pyramid is constructed and all members' arms are straight and locked. The pyramid must be held for a minimum of 10 seconds or time will not be counted.

F. Tug of war will consist of members pulling against another fraternity or sorority. The number of members on the team is 6 people but 8 people may weight in. Fraternities may have a maximum of 1060 pounds combined for their team. Sororities will have a maximum weight of 870 pounds combined for their team. The team members must be selected from those 8 who weighted in and a final list of the 6 team members must be supplied by chapters at time of check in. Tug will also be a double elimination format. Rope is 75 feet long and 1.5 thick. See Addendums attached.

G. Weigh in will be immediately after Quiz Bowl. Weigh in will being at 8:30PM or when Quiz Bowl is over.

H. Any technique may be used during this event, so long as you stay within the stated boundaries. The total boundary is 8 ft. in width. The rope will be centered within this measurement.

I. "Out of bounds" will be justified by the entire team's side of the rope from the first member to the last member out side of the 8 ft region stated above.

J. No members may let go of the rope until the referee declares the winner due to risk of injury.

K. No metal spike cleats will be allowed and gloves must be worn during tug of war.

L. Only the designated tug team members that have been chosen from the original 8 that were weighed in may be allowed on the field during the tug of war match. In addition, there may be one tug of war coach from each team, the tug of war judges, the Greek Advisor, the Greek Olympics Day Chairs, and members of Greek Council Executive Board may also be present on the tug of war field. All other chapter members must remain behind the track.

M. Members of the tug team are not allowed to wrap the rope around their bodies. If any member is caught doing this it will result in disqualification and/or forfeiting the particular tug match.

N. Any unsportsmanlike conduct or fowl language directed at another organization, judges, advisors, or council members will not be tolerated. Any person or persons found not in compliance with this will be asked to leave the arena and their respective team will be penalized. This may include the forfeit of the tug of war events and the subsequent loss of points, or the disqualification of the organization from all Greek Olympic events and the subsequent loss of points. It is the responsibility of the Greek Advisor, Greek Olympic Judges, and Executive Board of Greek Council to monitor these offenses.

O. The secret event will take place during Greek Olympics which will be facilitated by the Greek Week chairs and day chairs of the event. No other members will have prior knowledge to this event.

P. Shoes must be worn for all events with the exception of girls pyramid.

V. Results of Winners

All events will be timed or measured. Points will be awarded for certain places and a combination of points will add for a final standing.

II. Location and Start Time:

The skits will take place at the Kellogg Gym. Skits will begin at promptly 7 P.M. All chapter representatives must be present at the raffle to pick the skit order. The raffle will take place at 5:00 P.M. All chapters should have their props and members at the stage area by 6:00 p.m. Ten people total in the skit and part of the prop crew will be discounted \$2.00 pre-paid and will be allowed in only through designated doors. Remember: Maximum discounted pre-paid performers: 10

III. Rules and Guidelines:

A. All skits will be between 3-8 minutes in length. And will only have 4 Minutes to setup and tear down the stage backgrounds. For every minute past the allotted time the team will be docked 2 points.

B. All CD's and tapes containing the chapters skits will be turned in by **April 30, 2009** for review.

C. **No additions or alterations may be made after April 30, 2009** without the permission of the Greek Week Chairs.

D. All skits will contain **no profanity and must be in good taste.**

E. No live animals, fire, or explosives of any kind are allowed.

F. Chapter's theme and all songs are due **by 10:00 P.M. on April 3, 2009.** As stated per page 10 of the rules.

G. Only one chapter may use one song regardless of different variations of the song.

H. The list of songs must list the Artist & Song Title.

I. There is a maximum of song titles Chapters may list and you must list the top 12 songs.

J. All skits must be of **tasteful** nature or your chapter will be automatically pulled off the stage which will result in a disqualification.

K. **Final copies of music skits must be turned in by April 30, 2009** including a breakdown of skit songs and times must accompany the CD.

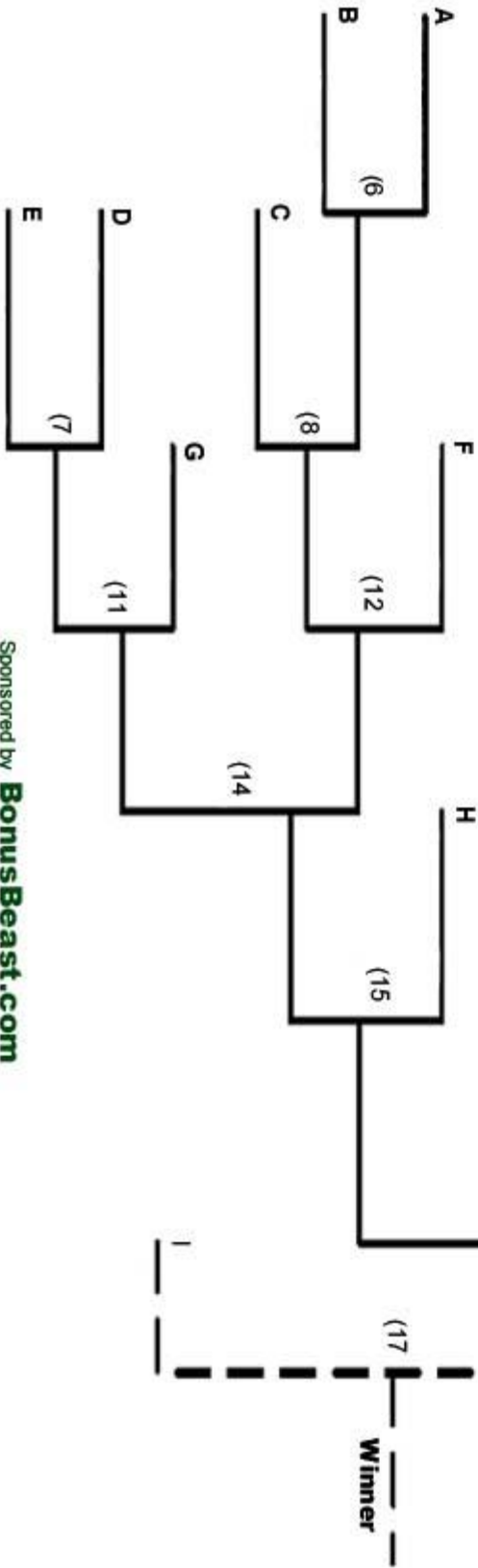

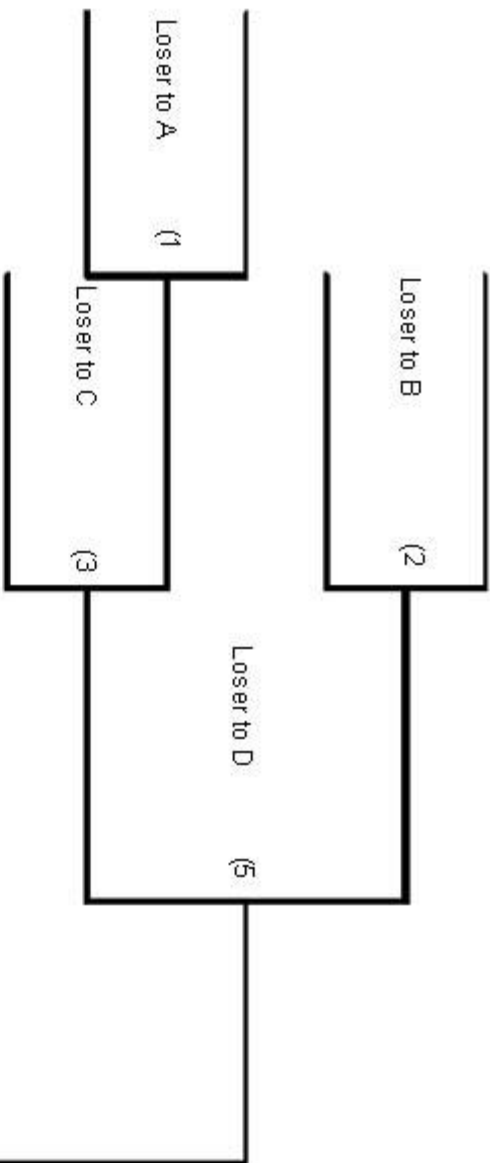
