Safety on Campus – Your Right to Know

Cal Poly Pomona places the highest priority on your safety, and we rely on community members to share our commitment and actively participate in creating a safe and secure living, learning and working environment. In compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (The Clery Act), the University's annual security report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in certain off-campus buildings or properties owned or controlled by Cal Poly Pomona and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. The report also includes institutional campus security policies, such as those concerning alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, crime reporting, sexual assault, and other matters. Drug Free Schools and Community Act

Cal Poly Pomona recognizes its responsibility to provide a safe and productive educational and work environment and seeks to create and nurture a campus community where healthy lifestyle choices are fostered and promoted. Students and employees are encouraged to seek assistance through available treatment programs.
